In Fall 2005, Howard Community College became the first community college in the nation to offer an Associate of Arts Degree in Conflict Resolution.

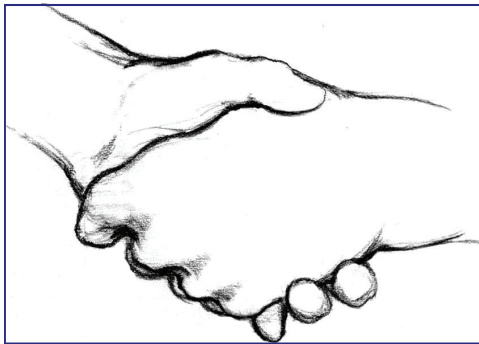
The Program teaches students Conflict Resolution theory and skills that are applied in many settings.
